
# Water Conservation Tips

Roosevelt Project Update: There will be some changes for the completion of the Roosevelt Drive project due to concrete delays and shortages. Phase 1 of this project, which is from Bowen Road to just south of Sunset Lane, has been milled and is awaiting concrete for slurry mix. The reason the road continues to be one-way traffic is so that Tarrant County can continue to smooth and prep the surface for concrete arrival. They now expect to receive concrete next week, July 12-13. With the concrete arrival, they will now be able to complete Phase 1 before school starts.

Taking into account the safety of all involved parties, Phase 2, Sunset Lane north to California Lane, unfortunately, will be delayed until next summer. There isn't another adequate window of time before then to complete the remainder of the road while school is out. However, after Roosevelt Drive Phase 1 completion this summer, Tarrant County will then move directly to Elkins Drive reconstruction, which was one of the next road projects on the city's list for completion. We appreciate your patience and understanding as we work to repair streets in DWG.

Safety Tip of the month: As your City Council and City Staff work diligently to improve the roadways in the City we want to ensure your safety and the safety of our workers. As most have already realized the speed limit on Roosevelt Dr. from Sunset Ln. to Bowen Rd. has been reduced to 20 mph. This is due to the hazardous conditions from and the ever-changing condition of the roadway as they continue to work on improvements. Please be cautious during daytime hours as workers



may be present, so we ensure their safety during this project. We are grateful for the help from Tarrant County Precinct 2 for their assistance on the completion of this project. This speed limit is in effect 24 hrs. a day so please use caution and be pleasant to others as we all struggle through these growing pains. We understand this is an inconvenience and we appreciate everyone's understanding while they try to complete this project.

School Zones- as the summer continues to fly by, we are less than a month away from school zones starting back. Please be patient as parents learn the new routes and get used to drop off and pickup lines. This is a very stressful first couple of weeks for all. Arkansas Ln. traffic for Arlington Classics Academy will start Wednesday August 10, and Key Elementary the next Monday, August 15. We will have extra patrol officers in the area to assist staff and parents with the procedures to ensure everything goes as smoothly as possible, however please plan for backup in the mornings, and afternoons.

If you have DWG DPS monitoring your alarm system, please help us complete your yearly update. Please contact dispatch at 817-275-1234 Ext 1 to get a new application form turned in. We request you test your alarm to ensure that all zones are still coming into our center properly. This process is to ensure we can contact you timely if the need arises, and to help ensure you have no technical issues onsite that could hinder our response in the future. Also, dispatch is manned 24/7 so we can complete the alarm testing whenever works best for your schedule, this process takes less than 10 minutes to complete. Excerpts from the January 11, 1934 Star Telegram relating to the beginnings of Dalworthington Gardens: "... construction on the first 24 homes at the proposed subsistence colony near Arlington would be underway within the next three weeks. ... road work now in progress ... directorate's wish to have all of the homes completed in time for Spring planting. The tracts will range in size from two to six acres." (Note: When built out, the original plat shows the smallest tracts in the Dalworthington Gardens colony were just shy of 4 acres with an unusually large one being almost 24.5 acres.)

Remembering that history is not only past events but what we create daily, we would like welcome June's new residents to DWG: the Cornish family, the Durand family, the Mann family and the Sliheet family.

If you'd enjoy a small tree in your landscape that's drought, heat and freeze resistant, as well as a wildlife favorite, consider the desert willow.

This low-maintenance tree has fragrant flowers that bloom all summer, attracting butterflies, hummingbirds, and other wildlife. Flower color ranges from pale pink to deep purple. It's native to Central and West Texas, and an excellent choice for areas that don't get a lot of rain; otherwise, it needs a well-drained bed. Pro tip: Desert willow blooms on new wood, so prune it regularly for more flowers.
