Chief's Message:

As we are fast approaching the end of the school year and start into summer, we would like to congratulate all parents, students, and teaching staff for all your hard work over the last year. CONGRATULATIONS to all our graduating high school and college seniors.



We LOVE the rain and to date cooler weather, however the rain has created havoc on the low water crossing. The recent storms damaged the roadway to the point that it is no longer passable. Arlington streets was notified of the issue and has already been out to assess the damage. Arlington expects to begin repairs on the roadway, starting next week (May 9-13th), however this repair process will be weather permitting. The expected potential time frame is 2-3 weeks once they are able to start the process. With this being said, we are aware this is a very traveled roadway and we plan on opening it as soon as possible.

We have had an increase in snake and wildlife calls over the past several months with all the rain pushing them out of the creek areas and onto residential properties. As most wildlife is very protected officers are unable to catch or kill wildlife unless it is posing an immediate risk to the public. Snakes...the dreaded subject, they are slithering into garages and yards more than normal right now. Please be aware in high grassy areas as they may be hard to see. If you are having problems with either, and need immediate assistance please contact dispatch and we will send an officer out to assist in relocating the animals if possible. Please know that officers will assess each situation on a case-by-case bases and have limited resources.

Tis the season! Our house watch program is in full swing right now with the summer months upon us. If you are new to the Gardens' we want to make sure that you are aware of the house watch program. This is a voluntary program that is offered as a free service to DWG residents. Anytime (year-round) that you plan on going on vacation contact dispatch and fill out a form and we will have officers check your residents twice a day. We offer this program as a proactive way to assist residents in keeping their property safe with no added worries while gone. For more information on this program please contact dispatch.

Flowers speak to the bumblebees using static electricity? When a flower has nectar, the static will tug at the tiny hairs on the bee, attracting it to the flower.

Do you have what it takes to attract bees, butterflies and humming birds to your garden? These special pollinators are important to all of us in many ways. They are frequent visitors to the DWG Mayor's Butterfly Garden this year. Their plant faves so far: Autumn Sage (red blooms) and Blue Mealy Sage. Most plants are labeled- check them out and plant a few at home or in your neighborhood plant beds. The May Night Salvia (indigo blooms), that was profusely blooming in April, has been pruned back to allow a second showing.

A BIG shout out to the hard working garden crew Jack Bookout, Horizon Plumbing and Cliff Mycoskie, SPSD who sponsored and developed the butterfly garden. You can see either of them out in the "patch" planting, pruning, weeding and improving the flower beds. Their care and devotion to the project have brought beautiful results that we all can enjoy.
